Wildflower Meadow and Pond

We are delighted to have received a grant and ongoing advice from the Sussex Lund Fund to help establish and enhance the wildflower meadow in the paddock in front of the house. This will include planting a native border hedge and ongoing work to make this area even more beautiful for our human visitors and beneficial for our wilder visitors, including white-legged damselflies. The pond will also receive attention, including re-establishing the banks that have eroded over time.
